Since the inaugural scholarships awarded by the Winchester Foundation in 2012, the recipients have grown to an astounding number of 1,403 recipients in 2023. Scholarships range from secondary schooling to tertiary education and bridge the gap for young people living in rural and regional areas of Queensland, to give them the same educational opportunities as their urban counterparts. The Foundation has assisted many recipients, from secondary graduating education through to university, with a variety of degrees from veterinary science, medicine, engineering, physiotherapy, nursing, occupational therapy and speech therapy, to name a few.

Many of these students graduate and return to regional areas to give back to their communities. Scholarship recipients will be forever grateful for the opportunity they have been given by Mrs Neilsen and Winchester Scholarships. To scholarship recipients, may you all continue to have a lifelong association with the Foundation and in doing so, help to realise a lasting memento to Mr and Mrs Neilsen.

The Winchester Foundation is also responsible for supporting many hundreds of students from twenty-two schools to attend the annual Whitsunday Voices Literacy Festival in Mackay. The Voices Festival gives students the opportunity to interact and meet with well-known authors and develop a love of reading and writing.
